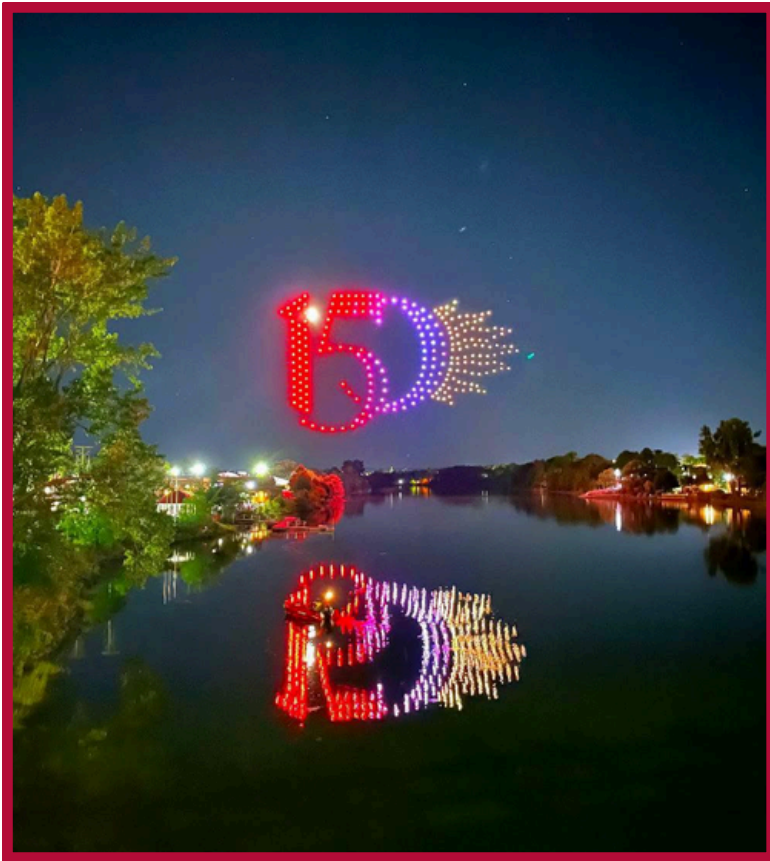

Need a Zoning Confirmation Letter? Here's How to Apply



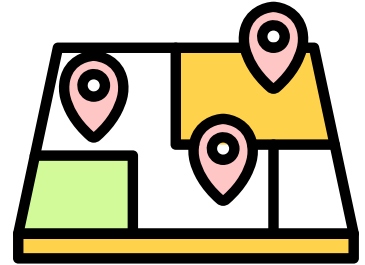
Purchasing, selling or refinancing property in the Town of New Glasgow?

You may need a Zoning Confirmation Letter, here's what you need to know! Whether you're a realtor, lawyer, or property owner, a Zoning Confirmation Letter helps clarify the permitted land use and zoning for a specific property. These letters are often requested during property transactions to support due diligence.

What's required?

Property address
PID (if available)
Who the letter is for
Where to send it

Fee: \$200 per property (PID)
Timeline: Minimum 10 business days

Outdoor Fire Safety

In 2022, the Town adopted the Fires and Burning of Material By-law, which outlines the proper way to enjoy outdoor fires. The provincial burn restrictions updated every day at 2pm outline the burning restrictions.

Under the Town of New Glasgow's Fires and Burning of Material By-law:

- Camping or shelter building in the woods on town-owned land is not permitted.
- There are also no open fires permitted in the woods.
- The fires must be in a recreational outdoor burning appliance and the manufacturer's operating instructions must be followed
- You can only burn seasoned dry wood no brush or leaves are allowed.
- The size of the fire cannot be any larger than 60 centimeters in width and no higher than 45 centimeters.
- There must be someone always present while the fire is burning, and this person must be a minimum of 19 years of age.
- You must have your fire pit at least 4.75m (15feet) from any structure or property line.
- You must also have a means to put out the fire close by.
- If you are going to have a small backyard fire, inform your neighbours to make sure it will not bother them. If a complaint comes in you will be asked to put the fire out.

Additionally, the province also states that daily fire restrictions apply in the woods or within one thousand feet of the woods. Both these restrictions apply to people's private property, like having a backyard campfire.

If you see a fire in a wooded area, call 911 and give the best description of its location for responding agencies.



Emancipation Day Flag Raising



On August 1, the Town of New Glasgow came together at Glasgow Square to raise the Emancipation Day flag - a powerful symbol of remembrance, resilience, and hope. Emancipation Day marks the abolition of slavery across the British Empire in 1834 and is a time to honour the strength and contributions of African Nova Scotians, whose legacies are deeply woven into our community.

During the ceremony, Mayor Nancy Dicks reflected on the importance of this day, noting that raising the flag must also serve as a promise to continue the work of addressing anti-Black racism, amplifying Black voices, and building a more just and inclusive community. We were also honoured to receive a message from the Honourable Twila Grosse, Minister of African Nova Scotian Affairs, highlighting the ongoing significance of this commemoration.

The Town extends sincere thanks to the organizers, volunteers, and participants whose dedication made the 35th Anniversary celebration such a memorable success.

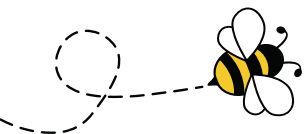

Historic Lulan Returns Home to New Glasgow



New Glasgow celebrated a proud moment in its 150th anniversary year with the homecoming of the Lulan, a treasured piece of firefighting history. On August 12, 2025, the New Glasgow Fire Department hosted a special evening at Station 33, welcoming the horse-drawn steam engine back from Halifax.

The program opened with remarks from Fire Chief Ross White, followed by the rousing Official Cry from Town Crier Jim Stewart. Her Worship Mayor Nancy Dicks shared heartfelt words on the Lulan's enduring legacy before the Halifax Fire Historic Society formally presented it to the Town of New Glasgow and its Fire Department.



Built in 1877, the Lulan served the community during its formative years, even answering the call after the Halifax Explosion. Named in honour of Pictou Landing First Nation Chief James Lulan, the engine has been fully restored and now stands as a symbol of resilience, history, and community pride.

The evening concluded with a reception, where residents and visitors admired the Lulan up close, reflecting on the deep ties between New Glasgow and its firefighting heritage.



New Glasgow Celebrates Leadership and Legacy at Mayor's Tea & Book Launch

On August 13, 2025, community members gathered at Glasgow Square Theatre for a special afternoon celebrating New Glasgow's history and leadership. The Mayor's Tea & Book Launch marked the unveiling of New Glasgow's 45 Mayors: Leadership and Legacy of a Riverside Town, a commemorative publication produced in partnership with the Pictou County Roots Society for the town's 150th anniversary.

The event featured warm welcomes from emcee Jack Kyte and a Land Acknowledgement by Morgan Simms, followed by an inspiring Official Cry from Town Crier Jim Stewart. Her Worship Mayor Nancy Dicks delivered heartfelt remarks before joining former mayors and Pictou County Roots Society's Brenda Hutchinson for the unveiling of the book cover.

Guests enjoyed an excerpt reading, presentations to former mayors and their families, and a special tribute to Chief Tamara Young of Pictou Landing First Nation. The celebration concluded with a lively reception and Mayor's Tea, where attendees connected over stories of New Glasgow's past and aspirations for its future.



Funding Announcement and Groundbreaking Ceremony for Viola's Way Placemaking Project

A significant step toward honouring African Nova Scotian history and fostering community inclusion took place in New Glasgow on August 28, 2025, with the groundbreaking of the Viola's Way Placemaking Project. Community members, dignitaries, and partners gathered on Provost Street, adjacent to the former Roseland Theatre, to celebrate the start of construction on the pedestrian-only space dedicated to reflection, celebration, education, and reconciliation.

Funded through a collaboration between federal, provincial, and municipal governments, Viola's Way will pay tribute to African Nova Scotian changemakers, including its namesake, civil rights pioneer Viola Desmond. Mayor Nancy Dicks described the project as "so much more than bricks and pathways," calling it a bold and beautiful step forward for the community.

The ceremony featured speeches, expressions of gratitude, and a shared sense of pride as shovels broke ground on a project set to become a lasting symbol of legacy, learning, and healing.



Music Shapes New Glasgow Summer Concert Series

International Town Criers Competition

This gathering served as a time to reflect on the stories of Survivors, honour the children who never came home, and acknowledge the strength of Indigenous families and communities.
