

## BY-LAW NO. 2

### BOUNDARIES BY-LAW

1. This By-law shall be known and may be cited as the "Boundaries By-law" of the Town of New Glasgow.

2. The boundaries of the Town of New Glasgow are as follows:

As appears in Chapter 105 of the Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1886, to wit: an Act to consolidate and amend the Acts relating to the Town of New Glasgow:

"Commencing at High Water Mark of the East River, on the north west corner of a farm formerly owned and occupied by one David Rose and subsequently the property of Harry Townsend;

THENCE running south forty-two degrees east one mile to a stone;

THENCE running south twenty-nine degrees west until it comes to a stone on the Old Telegraph Road, or Lorne Street;

THENCE running south thirty-three degrees thirty minutes west until it comes to a stone on the south line of lands formerly owned or occupied by John Ross;

THENCE running along said line north forty-one degrees and thirty minutes west eighty-two chains or until it comes to the west side of the East River;

THENCE running northwesterly along said River until it comes to the south line of the property of the late William Duff;

THENCE running along said line north eighty-four degrees west sixty chains until it comes to a stone;

THENCE running north twenty-nine degrees east until it comes to a stone on the north line of lands formerly owned or occupied as the William McIntosh farm, one mile from the River;

THENCE running along said line south eighty-four degrees east eighty chains until it comes to the River;

THENCE across the River to the place of beginning.

3. The Town of New Glasgow shall be divided into three wards in accordance with Schedule "A" of the aforescribed Act:

(1) Ward 1 , comprising all that part of the Town of New Glasgow lying on the east side of the East River and to the south of the center line of MacLean Street;


(2) Ward 2 , comprising all that part of the Town of New Glasgow on the east side of the East River and to the north of the center line of MacLean Street;

(3) Ward 3 , comprising all that part of the Town of New Glasgow on the west side of the East River;

4. The "Boundaries of Wards By-law" approved by the Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia in Council on the 27th day of January, 1927 and all amendments thereof, are hereby repealed.




